Or to sing the song again. In that way I encourage you to interact with this service – pause and playing as it helpful – let it be a tool to help you worship and connect with this Day of Days...*


***On this Good Friday, as I enter prayer and worship now, I pause to be still. To recentre my scattered senses upon the presence of God....***

### **Collect Prayer for Good Friday:**

#### **Together we pray.**

**Eternal God,  
in the cross of Jesus  
we see the cost of our sin  
and the depth of your love:  
in humble hope and fear  
may we place at his feet  
all that we have and all that we are,  
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

### **1. Opening Hymn: There is a Green Hill**



**First Reading** – Genesis 22:v1-18 – The obedience of Abraham as he is asked to sacrifice his only son Isaac and God’s promise of blessing to the world.

**2. Song: Lord have mercy (Robin Mark)**

**Second Reading** – Isaiah 52:v13- end ch. 53 – The prophecy of the suffering servant; and the purpose and achievement of that suffering...

**3. Song: At the cross (love ran red)**

**Third Reading** – Psalm 22 – Words originally written by David, as he endured a great trial, yet through his suffering, he gained victory. These words were used by Jesus on the cross.

**4. Song: Revelation Song.**

**Fourth Reading** – John chapter 18 : Jesus is betrayed, and put on trial before the Jewish leaders and then Governor Pilate. And Peter denies Jesus three times as predicted by Jesus at the Last Supper.

**Silence between these readings to reflect a minute.**

**Fifth Reading** – John chapter 19:1-37 Jesus’s Crucifixion and Death

### **The Gospel of the Burial of Christ is read (John 19:38-42)**

<sup>38</sup> Later, Joseph of Arimathea asked Pilate for the body of Jesus. Now Joseph was a disciple of Jesus, but secretly because he feared the Jewish leaders. With Pilate's permission, he came and took the body away. <sup>39</sup> He was accompanied by Nicodemus, the man who earlier had visited Jesus at night. Nicodemus brought a mixture of myrrh and aloes, about thirty-five kilograms. <sup>40</sup> Taking Jesus' body, the two of them wrapped it, with the spices, in strips of linen. This was in accordance with Jewish burial customs. <sup>41</sup> At the place where Jesus was crucified, there was a garden, and in the garden a new tomb, in which no one had ever been laid. <sup>42</sup> Because it was the Jewish day of Preparation and since the tomb was near by, they laid Jesus there.
