The Gathering of God's People

Welcome everyone by Revd Grant.

Today is All Saints Day, All Saints Sunday.

From today Kingdom Season begins which takes us up to Advent which begins today at the last Sunday of this month. Our liturgy will reflect our Kingdom season.

Today is also the International Day of Prayer for the Persecuted (IDOP) Church, as Christians across the West focus on prayer for our persecuted brothers and sisters in Christ, the saints who suffer for seeking to worship and follow Christ.

In the brief silence we settle into prayer...

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you



All and also with you.

'You will show me the path of life; in your presence is the fullness of joy and in your right hand are pleasures for evermore.' *Psalm 16:10*

Opening Song

We have come together, the people of God, drawn by his Spirit, longing for his Word, to praise the holy name of the Lord, to share his glorious news of grace, to pray for our needs and the pain of the world, to rejoice in his love and be sent in his peace.

Prayers of Penitence

Jesus said: Repent for the kingdom of heaven is close at hand.

So let us turn away from our sin and turn to Christ, confessing our sins in penitence and faith.

Silence

All Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned against you and against our neighbour in thought and word and deed, through negligence, through weakness, through our own deliberate fault.

We are truly sorry and repent of all our sins.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who died for us, forgive us all that is past and grant that we may serve you in newness of life to the glory of your name. Amen.

May the God of love and power forgive you and free you from your sins. Heal and strengthen you by his Spirit, and raise you to new life in Christ our Lord.

All Amen.

Blessed is the Lord,

All for he has heard the voice of our prayer;

therefore shall our hearts dance for joy and in our song will we praise our God.

Blessed are you, Sovereign God, ruler and judge of all, to you be praise and glory for ever. In the darkness of this age that is passing away, may the light of your presence, which the saints enjoy, surround our steps, as we journey on. May we reflect your glory this day and so be made ready to see your face in the heavenly city where night shall be no more. Blessed be God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit:

The night has passed, and the day lies open before us; let us pray with one heart and mind. Silence is kept.

As we rejoice in the gift of this new day, so may the light of your presence, O God, set our hearts on fire with love for you; now and for ever. **Amen.**

Affirmation of Faith:

(from the Athanasian Creed)
We proclaim the Church's faith in Jesus Christ,
